Admin Message

Greetings from the Principal ...

Last week, I attended a lecture given at St. Paul's College by Dr. Richard D'Souza, a Jesuit priest and scientist currently working for the Vatican Observatory. The title of his talk was *God and the Galaxies, A Jesuit Perspective from the Vatican Observatory.* Those of you who know of my scientific interests would readily understand how much I appreciated the astronomical physics and cosmology topics presented. However, what resonated most strongly with me was the second portion of Fr. D'Souza's presentation, during which time he commented upon how Religion and Science are



not at all in conflict; that these are both means of deepening our understanding and love for God. I took particular note of a phrase he used: "Studying the Universe (i.e. Science) is an act of worship." What a wonderful thought!



In closing the talk, Fr. D'Souza showed a slide which included the following statements, both of which were readily adopted into my existing philosophy:

"Science is about the explanation; Religion is about the meaning."

"Science takes things apart to see how they work; Religion puts things together to see what they mean."

It just so happens that these statements came to mean even more to me later on than they did during the lecture. A couple of days later, after the First Sunday of Advent Mass, I began to relate the statements to the Advent season, and to the coming of Christ at Christmas. For example, I thought: like the study of Science, it is no doubt important that we learn of the facts and the evidence of the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ. But more like Religion, we need to also remember to studiously ponder and wonder in Faith at the fullness of the *meaning* of the Incarnation. Carrying this reflection further, we can consider how we all come to learn about God in some ways with our minds (like Science), but also with our hearts (like Religion/Faith). I encourage you to read the statements again; see what they might say to you, and listen to what God may be telling you too!

I wish all of you a peaceful and prayerful season of Advent.

Winnipeg Public Library (http://wpl.winnipeg.ca/library/)

Winnipeg Public Library has 20 locations serving the citizens of Winnipeg. The Library offers a variety of services including a broad range of collections, programs for all ages, and information services. Your library card may be used at any branch in the system.

- ★ Library cards are free if you live or pay property or business taxes in the City of Winnipeg.
- **→** To get a card, download a membership application form, fill it out and hand it in at any branch. Membership application forms are also available at any branch in the system.
- → You will be asked to show acceptable identification. If you live in Winnipeg, but you have no ID, you can still get a library card it will be a limited card allowing you to borrow up to 2 items at a time instead of 50. All other benefits of a library card apply. You can update your limited card to a full card at any time by showing acceptable identification.
- **→** Parents or guardians of children and young adults 17 years and under must sign their children's library membership application.

If you share custody of a child, please ask at your local branch about their Juvenile Joint Custody membership cards.

Online access to your library account allows you to:

- → view library material currently checked out or overdue
- → view due dates for library material
- view fines owing
- → renew library material
- + request library material that is checked out or at another branch
- → view the status of your requests
- change your Personal Identification Number (PIN)

The Winnipeg Library has a huge book selection. Many books are available in an electronic format. The library is a great place to study and access books that are not available at St. Maurice School!


